Leader Training Guidelines

The Leader Training Program

The Leader Training program helps leaders easily graduate through the courses quickly with little duplication. Training begins in three easy steps. First up: Basic Training. Next, your experience builds with Leader Specific Training, and finally maintain your education with the Supplemental and Advanced Training.

Step 1: The Basics

Taken immediately by all new Adult Volunteers

* Fast Start and Youth Protection**

- get your program safely off to a good start
- taken only once
- online courses: www.scouting.org

* New Leader Essentials:

- highlights fundamentals of the Scouting Programs.
- Included at the District one day Training

** to be taken once every two years

Step 2: Position Specific Training

*Cub Scout Level:

- Three Modules: "This is Cub Scouting", "How We Have Fun", and position specific.

- First two modules are taken only once, the specific is re-taken when you change positions.

- BALOO: Basic Adult Outdoor Leader Orientation

- not required for any individual leader, but there must be at least one BALOO-trained leader on outings.

* Boy Scout Level:

- Troop Committee Challenge

- online course: www.scouting.org

-Scoutmaster Assistant and Scoutmaster Leader Specific Training: take the applicable course for your position and retake the training when your position changes.

-Introduction to Outdoor Skills: required for Scoutmasters and Assistants- highly recommended for any leader who regularly camps with the troop.

*Venturing Level:

- Venturing Adult Leaders Basic Training:

- for all Venturing Volunteers

Additional Boy Scout and Venturing Training:

Safe Swim Defense, Safety Afloat, and or Climb On Safely are required if your outing involves one or more of these activities. These courses are offered online at www.scouting.org.

Planning and Preparing for Hazardous Weather

Training: All leaders going on outings will be required to have this training..This course is offered online.

Step 3: Supplementary and Advanced Training

*Cub Scout Level and Boy Scout Levels:

-Roundtable: Monthly meetings to support your pack and den programs.

- Trainer's Edge: for those who train adult leaders.

-Wood Badge: Scouting's most advanced adult leadership training.

*Venturing Level:

- Roundtable: monthly meeting to support and inform leaders of your program.

-Trainer's Edge: training adult leaders

- Powderhorn/Kodiak/Venturing Leadership Skill Course: teaches you how to conduct a high adventure course, and for teaching skills for both adult and youth leaders.

-Wood Badge: Scouting's most advanced adult leadership training course

*Unit, District and Council Level Volunteers:

- Wood Badge: Scouting's most advanced adult leadership training course.
